




















# Diatonic Dominoes

## Diatonic Dominoes 2-4 players How to Play

Choose whether to play with blue or yellow side of tiles. If playing with 2 players, deal 7 dominoes to each player. If playing with 3/4 players deal 5 dominoes to each player. The first player puts down a domino in the centre of the table. Players then take turns to place a matching domino on the open end of a domino on the table. If the domino is a double it should be placed vertically. A blank tile can be used anywhere. If a player cannot go, they must pick a new tile from the "boneyard" (spare tiles) until they can play. The winner is the one to get rid of all their tiles, or the one with the least number of tiles when no more plays can be made.
